 - Five are demonstration stations teaching a variety of disaster-related skills

- Amateur radio operators practice both their CERT and emergency communications skills
- Networking opportunities with members of other CERT programs at the Waterin' Hole (otherwise known as the Red Cross Canteen!) and while enjoying lunch

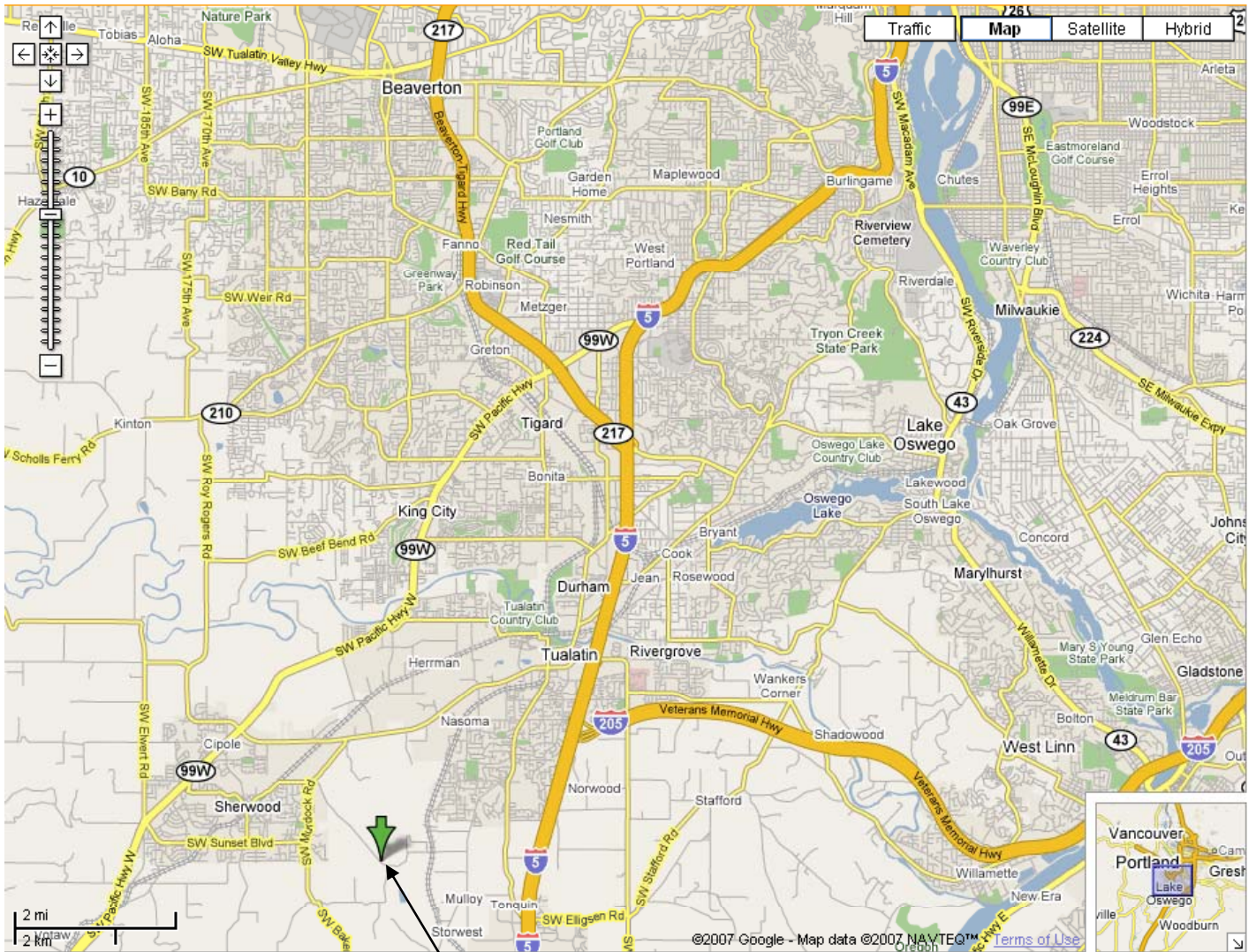

Some things you'll need to know:

- **Event Focus:** *This is, first and foremost, a CERT training event. (It is NOT a competition!) Don't be concerned if your skills are a little rusty. You will get a short refresher before entering each skill drill, and there is opportunity to ask questions before/during/after each drill.*
- **No Animals are Involved!**: Sorry to disappoint you, but we're just using the rodeo theme to add to the fun!
- **Clothing:** Wear comfortable clothing that you won't mind getting dirty. Long pants are required, and long-sleeved shirts are recommended. You will be in and out of buildings during the entire Rodeo. Please wear protective footwear and layered outer clothes appropriate for weather conditions.
- **CERT Kit:** Please bring your personal CERT kit. At a minimum, you will need your **CERT vest, hard hat, safety goggles, heavy work gloves, dust mask, flashlight, whistle, clipboard, pen & paper, and water bottle**. All items should be in a carrying bag or backpack that leaves your hands and arms free. Expendable items, such as medical supplies for the bandaging and splinting drill, will be provided.
- **Check-in:** Check-in will be in the Administration Building auditorium. Please check in between 7:45 and 8:15 a.m. That will give you time to meet the other members of your team and get ready for the Rodeo.
- **Rodeo Teams:** You will be randomly assigned to a rodeo team. We are intentionally mixing up members from different teams for several reasons: to make it less competitive and more focused on training, to introduce you to new friends, to learn how other CERT teams operate, and to share good ideas.
- **Amateur Radio Operators:** If you are registered as an amateur radio operator, you need to check in before 8:00, then attend a 15 minute briefing in Classroom #3.
- **Food and Refreshments:** Box lunches will be provided. With prior notice, we can accommodate some dietary restrictions; so please ask. A mobile canteen will also be available throughout the day with water, punch, coffee, hot cocoa, and cookies for your snacking pleasure between drills. Please also bring a personal water bottle.
- **Parking:** Parking is to your left as you drive into the training center.
- **Victims:** Please wear old clothes that you don't mind getting stained or dirty. We have many options for wounds,
